Time tested Four months/1500 miles What's good? It only took a few miles for this new lid to bed in and feel comfortable, and when riding on a warm day it's cool, literally, and I definitely feel the experience of riding. The visor is easy to use, with well positioned tabs to pull it down. Open-face lids often run the risk of making you look as though you're about to be shot out of a cannon, but this one looks great and I particularly like this colour option as it matches my Harley-Davidson Street 750 perfectly.

What's not? The visor has a tendency to steam up and there isn't a way to fit a Pinlock or similar device, which is a shame. As there's no room for an internal sun visor it's back to either swapping visors or shoving sunglasses inside the lid, which I dislike. Any faster than about 60mph and my eyes stream and I also have an embarrassing tendency to dribble, which is never an attractive look! There's also no getting away from the fact that I do feel a bit exposed and vulnerable riding
