
months / 1500 miles There are lighter flip-fronts. You'll find others with a more luxurious interior too. not to mention superior

visor clip whatsits. However, you'll struggle to find another modular lid that gets near the Givi's value. Comfy on long rides, the X.23 doesn't look like the front hinges open and feels like a regular

full face. Vents are easy to work with gloves on and provide effective breeze, the seatbelt-style fastening is a doddle, and the sun visor is controlled easily with a lever on the side (so no patting the top of your head to find it). No misting either, thanks to being supplied with both a Pinlock insert and a breath guard.

Yet despite all this positivity the X.23 is a snip-like £169. Shop around and you'll find the helmet for £125, or cheaper still in solid colours. It's a steal, is that,

'Shorties that pack protection'

Tested by Emma Franklin for three years/10,000 miles



These Dinamicas are short boots that feel and perform like proper sports boots. Obviously,

there's no lower-leg coverage, however there's so much structure and protection around the ankle, heel and toe that they feel really reassuring to ride in. They were comfortable right from the word go, and they feel like slippers – albeit very supportive ones - three years down the line.

There's very little wear either to the upper or the sole, and the rear zip at the Achilles area is tough and holding up well. The only little criticisms are that the Daineses lack breathability in hot weather, and the waterproof membrane keeps most of the rain out but leaves feet feeling a little damp. The sole is also fairly rigid – which is great for protection but means they feel a bit clumpy to walk around in.

Despite sitting at the lower end of the price scale for this kind of boot, the Tractech Evo 3 manages the higher CE level 2

rating for abrasion and impact resistance, dropping 500 to the minimum 1 standard for transverse rigidity. They look the business in this black and fluro yellow, too, but there are less lurid options available if you prefer. The venting and perforated leather work really well and keep your feet cool on the move, while the bracing system means it's very easy to operate the foot controls but I do prefer to feel more supported from a sporty boot. Thanks to lockdowns I've not put many miles on these yet so the star ratings are for my first impressions.




