

Made from microfibre and Dainese's 'D-Stone' fabric. Rear-entry zip design is a unique feature and works well, making it easy to slip these boots on and off. Uses Dainese's D-WP waterproof membrane which kept our tester's feet dry in an aggressive spray test, but did allow a tiny amount of water to pass through when immersed. Only CE-rated to the lower Level 1 standard for abrasion, impact cut and rigidity, which is a shame given Dainese's MotoGP reputation and the hardly-cheapskate price. Feel is excellent, articulation is perfect and neat Velcro adjusters mean they can be made to fit a range of calf sizes. Decent discounts can be found online, too.

Substantial shin plate and prominent ankle bracing give these a very racy look. Feel quite stiff in construction though – it can be difficult to reach your left foot forwards enough to get under the gear pedal. That bracing had a habit of digging into ankles on both sides too. Waterproofing is provided by RST's own SinAqua membrane, which stayed totally dry in the spray test, thought did let water through when the boots were submerged. Fit is good, through it takes a couple of goes to get the main zip done up and the Velcro closed properly.
